 - 8.1.2 The 2024 ND Red Select Sale has a nice offering.
 - 8.1.3 A sincere "Thank You" was given to Kenny Forster, Forster Red Angus for their outstanding donation of the 2024 Donation Heifer.
 - 8.1.4 Discussion was held on the commission costs of the sale. It was stated that Kist will not change their commission rate.
 - 8.2 FCCP/Pro Cow Sale Committee: Sam Twedt Reported.
 - 8.2.1 FCCP/Red Influence Sales in ND:

Rugby Livestock, Rugby ND: Sale was in November and another scheduled for January 2025. Lake Region Livestock, Devils Lake, ND:

Stockman's Livestock, Dickinson ND: Hosted a successful Red Influence Sale in October with over 1500 head of Reds consigned. The Reds were competitive price wise with the black hides.

Lemmon Livestock, Lemmon SD: The barn is under new ownership but hosted a Red influence sale in October. The new owner, Rowdy Benson, asked RAAA Marketing Specialist, Rachel Oliver about Red Angus marketing programs and is excited about the breed. Sidney Livestock, Sidney MT: Hosted a successful Red Influence Sale.

- 8.2.2 The NDRAA board made posters for sale barn's that say: "Red Angus is Angus".
- 8.2.3 NDRAA directories will be put into the sale barns by local members.
- 8.2.4 Rachel Oliver mentioned that the marketing team needs the support of the seed stock producers and the ND Red Angus Association with sales. Commercial producers need to see that the seedstock producers support them.
- 8.3 Advertising & Promotions Committee: Annette Steffan/Sam Twedt Reported.
 - 8.3.1 Website: Annette reported that the website is up. The web address is ndredangus.org. The new directory will be posted on the website. Membership lists will be updated after the 2024 Annual Meeting. The

banquet RSVP has been very successful with about 80% of the RSVP's coming through the website. Analytics' were just ordered for the website to see who was looking at it so there was no report on numbers of people going to the website.
