

ND Junior Red Angus Show

ND State Fair Classes

All participants receive a T-Shirt and may also include a garment bag, rope halter, feed pan, cup and ice cream ticket from "Pride Booth" Formerly Dairy Association Booth. All prizes and rewards are paid by the ND Junior Red Angus Association. Prizes will be determined by the financial stability of the NDJRAA and Sponsorships.

Division 1: Registered 1A and 1B Heifers: Females must be registered with RAAA or CAA. Only registered Red Angus females 87%-100% with no disqualifying marks will be eligible to show. 87%-100% cattle will show together in the same class. All females must be polled. females must adhere to the RAAA or CAA Breeder's Guide for registration. Registered 1A and 1B Market animals must be red hide in color. No Category II/Black Red Carriers allowed. All registered animals must be under 2 years of age and will be shown as individuals.

Division 2: Registered Black Red Carrier Heifers: Females must be registered with RAAA or CAA. Females must be Angus genetics of 87% and above. Parentage for the animal must be the following: 1. one (1) parent must be a category 1A (100%) or 1B (87% and above) with the RAAA or a Red Angus with the CAA. 2. The second parent may be a category 1A (100%), 1B (87% and above), or a Category 2 (87% and above with ineligible white or black hide) with the RAAA or a registered Angus with the CAA or the AAA. Animals may not have any disqualifying white: The skin color of all animals for which application for registration is made must be BLACK. An animal red in color or with white skin or hair above the underline, in front of the navel or on leg, foot, or tail, shall not be eligible for this show. All females must be under 2 years of age and will be shown as individuals. All females must be polled.

Division 4: Percentage Heifers Females must be no less than 50 percent Red Angus. The sire or the dam must be a registered Red Angus. Must be red, red & white, or a yellow hide and polled (no black hided or black animals, refer to the RAAA Breeder's Guide for disqualifying characteristics). All females must be under 2 years of age and will be shown as individuals. A scurred animal is considered polled if you choose not to remove the scurs, if you surgically or mechanically remove the scur you will be disqualified.

ND Red Select Sale purchased females. Females that were purchased by ND Junior Red Angus members will be designated with an * by the animal/exhibitor. If these animals win overall grand or reserve female in the ND Junior Red Angus State Show, they will receive a \$750 credit from NDRAA towards the purchase of a heifer in the next ND Red Select Sale.

Division 6: Bred and Owned Registered 1A and 1B Females (Junior member/members ranch must be the breeder and sole owner of the female. ET females will be assessed by a committee if they are eligible to compete in the Registered 1A and 1B bred and owned female division. Division 1 and Division 5: Registered 1A and 1B females are only eligible for this award).

Division 10: Registered 1A and 1B Market: Steers must be registered with the RAAA or CAA. Only registered Red Angus steers 87%-100% with no disqualifying marks will be eligible to show. 87%-100% cattle will show together in the same class. All steers must be polled. Steers must adhere to the RAAA or CAA Breeder's Guide for registration. No age designation will be used for the determination of lots. Market animal weights will be used from registered weights for Open Class weigh in. Market animals will be divided by weights if necessary. Registered 1A and 1B Market animals must be red hide in color. No Category II/Black Red Carriers allowed. All market animals must be under 2 years of age and will be shown as individuals.

Division 11: Black Red Carrier Market: Black Red Carrier Market cattle may be registered with RAAA or CAA or be verified through Angus Access or the CAA equivalent of Angus Access. Angus Access, previously known as the Feeder Calf Certification Program, is the beef industry's first genetic, age and source verification program – built to USDA-approved standards and trusted by Red Angus producers for more than 30 years. With more than three million head enrolled, Angus Access has seen many years of growth as a Genetic, Source and Age Program. The Angus Access "Yellow Tag" is recognized as the symbol of guaranteed "Angus" genetics and a trusted source for both feeders and packers filling "Angus" product lines. Enhancing the value of Red Angus genetics since 1995, Angus Access builds a reputation through source verification to the ranch of origin and coupled with group age verification, provides access to export market premiums.

To be eligible, the calf must qualify as follows:

- Traceability to at least 50% registered Angus bloodlines; the progeny of a sire and/or dam registered in the RAAA database (Category 1A, 1B or 2) or cattle traceable to two grandparents registered in the RAAA database (Category 1A, 1B or 2).
- Source verified to the ranch of origin.
- Group age verified.

To enroll Red Angus-sired calves in the program, contact the value-added department at ags@redangus.org or call 940-477-4593. Participants will conduct an over-the-phone questionnaire to determine qualifications and be given the opportunity to purchase program tags. The market animal must carry a traceable Red Angus program tag.

All Black Red Carrier market cattle must be polled. Black Red Carrier Market cattle must be Angus genetics of 87% and above. Parentage for the animal must be the following: One (1) parent must be a category 1A (100%) or 1B (87% and above) with the RAAA or a Red Angus with the CAA. The second parent may be a category 1A (100%), 1B (87% and above), or a Category 2 (87% and above with ineligible white or black hide) with the RAAA or a registered Angus with the CAA or the AAA. Animals may not have any disqualifying white. The skin color of all animals for which application for registration is made must be BLACK. An animal red in color or with white skin or hair above the underline, in front of the navel or on leg, foot, or tail, shall not be eligible for this show. All market animals must be under 2 years of age and will be shown as individuals.

Division 12: Commercial Market

Commercial Market animals must be red, red/white, or yellow hide in color and sired by a Red Angus Bull or out of a Red Angus Cow. This is a true commercial ranch raised market animal, third party verification maybe required. Animals will be screened by a committee. All market animals must be under 2 years of age and will be shown as individuals.

Division 13: Percentage Market

Percentage Market Animals must be no less than 50 percent Red Angus. The sire or the dam must be a registered Red Angus. Animal must be red, red & white, or a yellow hide and polled (no black hided or black animals, refer to the RAAA Breeder's Guide for disqualifying characteristics). A scurred animal is considered polled if you choose not to remove the scurs, if you surgically or mechanically remove the scur you will be disqualified. All market animals must be under 2 years of age and will be shown as individuals.

Division 19: Showmanship

Showmanship classes will be judged separately immediately following the show. Juniors must participate in showmanship classes with their animals except for pee-wee showman. Pee-wee showman must be accompanied by another ND Junior Red Angus member. Pee-wee showmanship will be a participation only class. ND Junior Red Angus members may participate in showmanship if they attend this event. However, to qualify they must use another member animal and must have participated in other ND Junior Red Angus events prior to this show.

Division 20: Herdsmanship.....Predator 13,000 watt Portable Generator

The purpose of Herdsmanship is for ND Junior Red Angus exhibitors to properly care for their livestock, pens & equipment, ensure safety and to always keep the animals and surrounding areas clean and attractive. Educational displays and public relations are also an important component of Herdsmanship. Herdsmanship judging begins when animals are entered on entry day and ends when the award is given. Judging will be at times not to interfere with the time of that species being shown. Guidelines for selecting a Herdsmanship winner include: 1) Animal clean always with grooming apparent. 2) Animals adequately cared for with proper feeding, clean and proper amount of bedding for stalls and adequate equipment. 3) Tack and feed area clean and neatly arranged. Fork handles and similar equipment are hung or kept in a secure and safe manner. 4) Proper courtesy and conduct always shown by exhibitors and at all places. All exhibitors are expected to participate in Herdsmanship. Exhibitors share of alley area kept clean. Wheelbarrows and equipment kept from aisle.

ENTRY INFORMATION

This show is open to members of the ND Junior Red Angus Association. Members who turned 22 years of age the day of the show are not eligible to show. No participants will be discriminated against as a result of a physical, emotional or mental handicap. The only requirement is to specify on the entry form so accommodations can be made.

ND Junior Red Angus Association membership fees are \$35 and are payable at entry time. All exhibitors must be an active ND Junior Red Angus Association member.

Cattle entered in this show must be officially registered in one of the following: the Canadian Angus Association (CAA) or the Red Angus Association of America (RAAA). Percentage Animals may be registered in other breeds as long as all percentage requirements are met.

ENTRY FEES:

All applications for entry must be accompanied by related fees. If the entry does not have fees enclosed, the application for entry will not be accepted or accepted conditionally. All international exhibitors must pay fees in certified U.S. currency. Entry fees are not stall fees and do not dictate stall space. ALL FEES ARE FINAL AND NON-REFUNDABLE.

- a. ND Junior Red Angus Association Membership - \$35.

b. Entry Fee - \$25 per entry/per show: Bred and owned entry fees are separate from owned entry fees. We do not assume if an animal is bred & owned that you also want to show it in the owned show. YOU MUST ENTER IN BOTH SHOWS.

c. Bedding Fee –is paid through the ND State Fair Livestock entry.

ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY:

OWNERSHIP: To be eligible for competition, animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or the exhibitor's family ranch.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Please refer to the Animal Health Requirements listed in the ND State Fair Premium Book. REGISTRATION: Cattle entered in this show must be officially registered in their respective breed association. The original registration certificate or pdf as printed out from the respective database is required at check-in.

ENTRY PROCEDURE: a. ENTRY APPLICATION: All applications for entry preferably must be made online at www.ndredangus.org b. ENTRY SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitutions will be allowed within the same sex. Substitutions must be declared at check in.
